# Signe Skott Cooper Hall School of Nursing Madison, WI



Although ranked in the nation's top nursing programs, the University of Wisconsin-Madison School of Nursing lacked a defined home on campus for decades, impacting students' ability to interact, and the school's ability to create a strong presence. Kahler Slater partnered with the school to create a new center for nursing education. Goals included emphasizing the school's history, responding to the impact of technology on healthcare and creating interdisciplinary learning opportunities to support the mission of training future caregivers.
