The new facility is designed to support two grade structures in a "school within a school" format: grades K-1 in an Early Learning Center, and grades 2–5 as an elementary school. The design provides individual, small-, medium- and large-group learning areas; however, promoting every space in the facility as a learning space—areas traditionally used as corridors are redesigned to function both as connectors and learning spaces. A primary goal for the facility is creating a focus on literacy and learning in a nonstandard learning environment. In response, the design places the media and technology center at the core with all other functions radiating from it.

The new facility minimizes disruption to the existing site as much as possible and allows for green space between the building and the existing roadway. The facility will use the nearby creek and watershed for hands-on learning for students within the riparian buffer.
