## Trevecca Nazarene University—Jackson Center for Music and Worship Arts Nashville, TN



To satisfy growing campus needs on a limited budget, a new two-story music education facility was created from an existing trucking logistics warehouse adjacent to Trevecca Nazarene University's campus. A modern interpretation of the classically styled stone buildings that define the campus core, the building serves as an architectural beacon and new southern gateway to campus.

The exterior's steel beam sign, repurposed floors and exposed beams on the interior reflect the building's heritage and prior use. With glowing white resin panels highlighting the roof structure, the new performance venue denotes a main campus edge.

Throughout the building, ample open space encourages interaction between students and faculty within the unique program. A music garden adjacent to the entry also provides an area for outdoor musical practice and smaller performances.

Three major practice and performance spaces host choral and instrumental events, and a variety of smaller musical and vocal practice spaces accommodate both single users and small bands.

The repurposed warehouse contains two large-volume musical practice and performance spaces, while the converted office wing provides classrooms and smaller practice rooms. Two separate additions include space for the administration department, additional classrooms and a large 250-seat performance venue.
