A tornado damaged several city-owned buildings in Springfield, Massachusetts. Elias Brookings School was severely damaged and due to the age of the building (1925), renovations and the requirements to meet new code compliance were not feasible. Development

The new 65,000 SF elementary school includes a central lobby staircase, gymnasium, cafeteria, media center, classrooms for music, art and community room spaces. Every classroom features smart boards, flexible layouts and furniture.

The exterior features a playground adjacent to a student garden and playing field. Design elements of the school reflect nearby buildings such as the red brick exterior chosen to mimic the architecture of Springfield College, and the Springfield Armory National Historic Site. Elias Brookings School was designed to meet Massachusetts's Collaborative for High Performance Schools designation.
