# Eagle Hill School Community Room Greenwich, CT

The goal of the Eagle Hill School Community Room project was to develop a flexible gathering space that could be utilized for the school's morning meetings and assemblies as well as indoor recess and athletic activities.

The completed project achieved this goal by replacing a limiting theater space with a new circular community room that features telescoping seating, natural light, acoustically conscious window shading, new sound and lighting equipment and a new lobby that provides a sense of arrival and a distinct main entry. The addition of the telescoping seating addressed the critical design challenge of creating a dually functional space.

The architecture of the community room captures the intimacy of the campus by creating a space that feels appropriate and welcoming for a group as small as 20 or as large as

350. The multi-purpose room was designed in keeping with the architectural aesthetic of the campus and is both dramatic and warm with a



circular timber ceiling, clerestory windows and a expansive curved window wall.

The community room succeeds in creating a space that can bring the entire student body and faculty together as a cohesive unit, while also providing the versatility of use for smaller events and athletic activities.
