Hawkins Hall Pond at SUNY Plattsburgh has always been a peaceful place to gather by the picturesque water. Tropical Storm Irene caused heavy damage, damaging mature trees and leaving the area barren. This, plus an aging asphalt pond liner and underground infrastructure, required a complete rehabilitation of the pond and nearby utility service.

Native stone mirrors the existing rock found in the Adirondack Mountains, with new stone around the perimeter of the pond as natural seating, and new benches to encourage connection. The pond features several educational areas, with one entire lobe that supports the growth of native wetlands. Faculty from the College Ecology program selected plants and provided input into the design of this educational area that will be used for teaching students about native horticulture.

A new floating fountain and waterfall with three small pools is visible from the sitting area outside Hawkins Hall. New trees and landscaping throughout enhance Hawkins Hall, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Several utility systems were also improved, including replacement of high temperature hot water lines and water pipes, additional water lines, separation of sanitary and storm lines that were originally combined, and new site lighting and conductors.
