


HIGH SCHOOL

Lorain High School Lorain, OH

Lorain High School has undoubtedly become a source of great pride for the City of Lorain and a major resource for the region. Located on a 30-acre urban site, the new state-of-the-art school incorporates elements of the former high school into its design as well as features reminiscent of Lorain's lakeside history.

Incorporated into the high school is the Urban Learning Campus which features administrative and educational spaces for a satellite location of the Lorain County Community College, serving not only the high school student population, but the broader community as well. This integration is one of the first in the country.

The design is reflective of a community college atmosphere consisting of three buildings linked by at-grade and elevated walkways. The north building includes the physical education facilities, student dining, culinary arts, media center, and administration offices. The central building includes the academic classrooms and support spaces. The south building includes the career tech labs, auditorium, music and performing arts, and the Lorain County Community College administration and classrooms.
